

## General rules of use and safety instructions for the hire of mountaincarts on the Hannig

- 1. Helmet compulsory! Riding without a helmet is not permitted.
- 2. Children under the age of 10 and less than 1.40 metres tall are not permitted to use the mountain cart.
- 3. It is not permitted to carry children or animals on your lap.
- 4. Minors **under the age of 16** are only permitted to ride a mountain cart on the route if accompanied and signed for by a responsible supervisor.
- 5. Wear sportswear, glasses/sunglasses and good shoes.
- 6. Persons under the influence of alcohol or drugs are not permitted to use the mountaincarts.
- 7. The body weight of the mountain cart rider must not exceed 120 kg.
- 8. Place your feet firmly on the footrests during the descent. Always hold the handlebars in both hands.
- 9. Always brake with both brake levers at the same time, otherwise the mountain cart may skid. The left brake lever actuates the brake on the left rear wheel and the right brake lever actuates the brake on the right rear wheel.
- **10.** Carry out a brake test at low speed as soon as you start riding to test the brakes and familiarise yourself with the mountaincart. Please report any technical defects immediately.
- 11. Only drive at a moderate speed and adapted to the local conditions so that you can stop safely at any time. Different road surfaces require different driving behaviour.
- 12. The driving speed must be reduced before taking corners. The mountaincart can tip over or break out if you corner too fast. Always lean your upper body towards the inside of the corner.
- 13. Racing, reversing, overtaking and tailgating are prohibited.
- 14. Keep sufficient distance from the mountaincart in front and from the edge of the carriageway.
- 15. Always be prepared for **pedestrians**, cyclists, electric vehicles, obstacles, potholes and wild animals on the route.
- 16. Make sure that no loose items of clothing, bags etc. can get into the tyres or brakes during the ride. Check that nothing can fall out of your bags.
- 17. The marked route may not be left.
- 18. Pay close attention to the signposting, especially when crossing paths or roads.
- 19. Stop the mountaincart in such a way that it can be recognised in good time and does not roll away or endanger other people.
- 20. In the event of serious damage to the rented mountaincarts caused by the user, Saastal Bergbahnen AG reserves the right to claim compensation.
- 21. In the event of technical faults, end the journey immediately and report/show the fault to railway staff: Tel. no.: +41 27 958 11 18.
- 22. Mountain cart riders must observe the general and special traffic regulations of the StVO (Road Traffic Regulations). Among other things, speed must be adapted to the weather, road and visibility conditions as well as personal ability.
- 23. The rented mountain carts **must be returned within one hour** of collection.
- 24. Returning the mountain carts: These can be conveniently transported to the valley station by lift.
